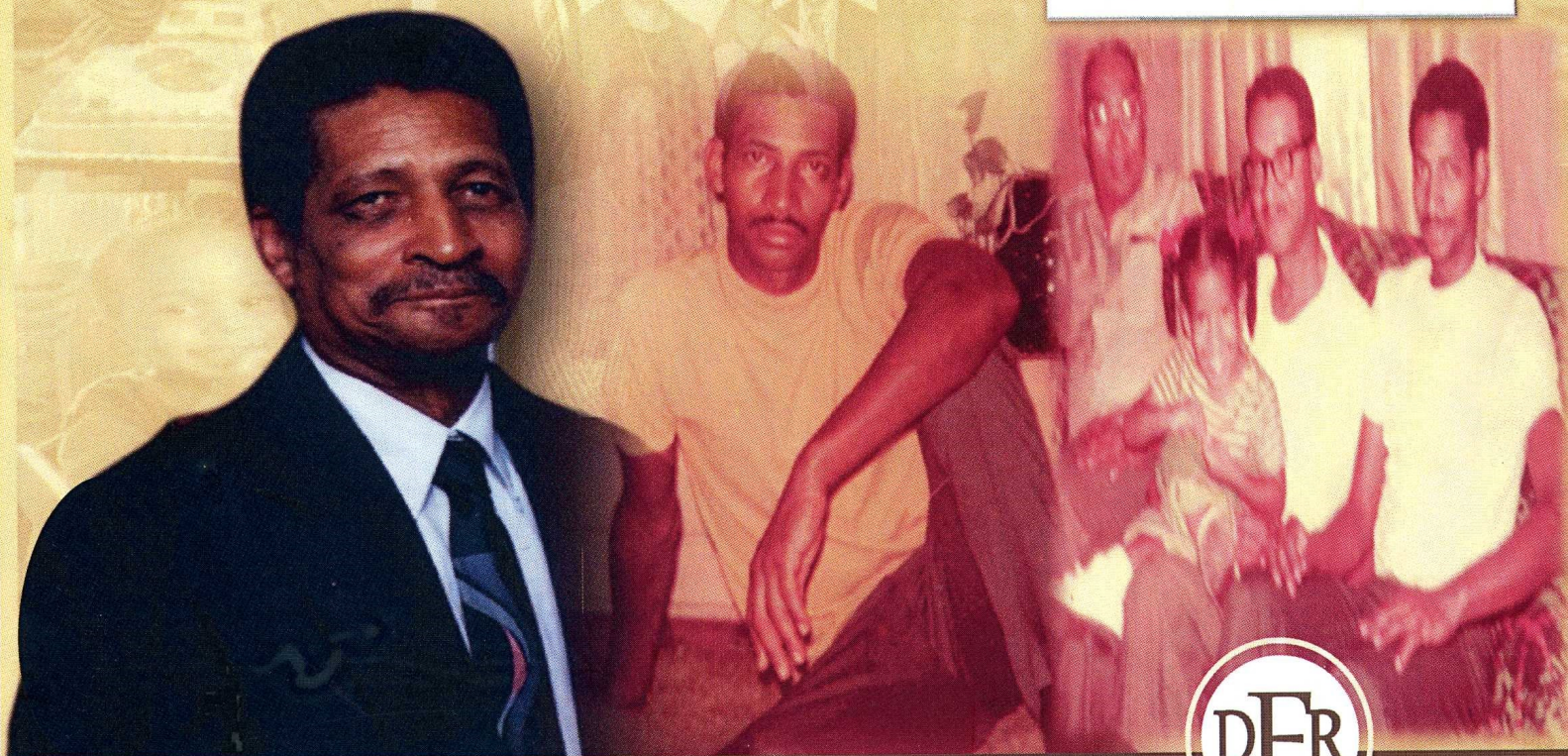
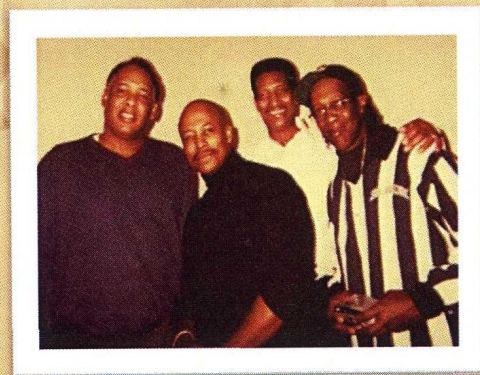

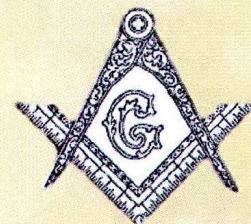
Delbert joined St. Paul Baptist Church under the late pastorate of Dr. Harold Kind, where he served faithfully until his death.
